In September of the same year I entered Bryn Mawr College, where I chose for my Major studies Greek and Latin, and took elective Post-Major courses in these subjects and in Sanskrit. June 6, 1889, I received the degree A. B. from Bryn Mawr College, and was awarded the Fellowship in Greek for the following year. For four years I was enrolled at Bryn Mawr as a graduate student in Greek, Latin and Sanskrit, although during two years (1890-92) I gave part of my time to teaching students preparing for college. In the year 1892-93 I held the American Fellowship of the Association of Collegiate Alumnae, and continued my studies at Bryn Mawr College. In June, 1893,...
